





Best Practices: Registration/ Enrollment

1. Require all families to submit financial information via FACTS (this will ensure accurate data collection).

2. Include income survey in registration packet.

- 3. Add an identifying question to your enrollment form:
 - What public school would your child attend if he/she attended public school?
