Message from the Superintendent

We all are wondering how we will continue to afford Catholic education. What can be done? One area that we should focus on is encouraging our families to become involved in the legislative process. Recently, at one of our meetings, Joe Sprague, Executive Director for the Washington State Catholic Conference, talked with us about the various issues that they are focused on during this legislative session. He also acknowledged the very well organized Washington State Teachers' Union, and the distant hope of providing tax credits for families who choose a Catholic education. I want to share with you the important information that he has posted on the new WSCC website:

The WSCC represents the state's 100 Catholic schools on matters of public policy. These important K-12 academic institutions deliver excellence in education to 27,000 students of all different economic backgrounds and, in the course of doing so, save the State of Washington over \$300 million per year. Three areas of concern:

- Access/ School Choice – The WSCC supports full and fair parental choice in education supported by tax relief, scholarships and other aid to parents so they may seek the educational opportunities best suited for their children.
- School Safety Children should feel and be safe when they are at school. Among the measures the WSCC is working to enact is a requirement that first responders notify all schools – public or private – of an emergency happening in the vicinity of a school that may require lock down or evacuation

- Early Childhood Education In line with the U.S. Bishops, the WSCC supports universal Pre-K initiatives that assist parents to choose among public, private and religious pre-schools. We also work to ensure that all students and their teachers, regardless of where they attend and teach school, share government benefits and services equitably.

Please encourage your families to [join the network](#). They will receive WSCC's legislative updates. And, when a clear opportunity arises in the future to make our Catholic school voices heard, we will be able to do so in a very strategic way!

SNOW DAY INFORMATION

As private schools, the minimum school year must consist of 180 days
OR a school-wide average of **1000** instructional hours in grades one through 12, and at least 450 hours for Kindergarten. You may count the total hours a student spends at school (including recess) with the exception of lunch. Private schools have the option of meeting the 1000 instructional hours or the 180 days. Waivers from meeting the 180 day requirement are not available for private schools.

IMMUNIZATION: MEASLES OUTBREAK

You should have received from the Washington State Board of Education a link to access the [“Immunization Information: Measles Toolkit”](#). It includes the requirements if there should be a case of measles reported in your school. We encourage staff to review records to be able to determine students (or staff) who are at risk in the event of a report of measles in your community. **Sample policy:** “If there is an outbreak within our school community of a vaccine-preventable disease that your child has not been immunized against, (school name) will follow the guidelines set forth by the Washington State Department of Health, and your child will be exempted from attending school for at least 21 days or until the last rash presents itself (which could be 60 days or longer).”

HIRING AND INTENT TO RENEW

Please be respectful of your fellow administrators and do not recruit their staff unless the staff member initiates the inquiry. If you are planning on changing the job description or duties you do not have to put that in the “INTENT” form, details and changes would come with the new covenant.
