Academic Support Programs available and additional cost to tuition	<p>St. Teresa Program: Students who have a documented learning disability and who would benefit from a smaller class size, modified curriculum, and more extensive accommodations. This is capped at 15 accepted students per year. The St. Teresa Program offers course offerings for all four years of English and social studies, as well as three years of science and theology. Specific math courses are not offered in the St. Teresa Program. Instead, because math placements can vary so significantly, a student is placed based on their performance on the math placement test taken in the spring prior to entering 9th grade. The math department provides a variety of math courses for all students, including students who specifically struggle in math. These math classes still keep the small teacher to student ratio and cover the required material at a slower pace. The St. Teresa program also has a dedicated elective (St. Teresa Supervised Study) that provides students with additional case management,</p>

study skills, executive coaching, and supports. There is an additional cost for this program (additional fee incorporated in tuition).

AVID:

AVID's mission is to "close the achievement gap by preparing all students for college readiness and success in a global society." This program is for students who might need additional support in a mainstream classroom with executive functioning, goal setting, and may or may not have accommodations. This class is taken as an annual year-long elective and follows the AVID curriculum. There are not additional costs for this program.

General Accommodation Plans:

All students who have a documented disability and are within a Mainstream class are provided with a Kennedy Catholic accommodation plan that outlines their disability. This requires an official diagnosis from a licensed care provider and must be renewed every three years. These plans can be sent to the College Board for consideration if families desire. There are no additional costs for these services.

Lancer Bridge Program:

August prior to 9th grade, students are invited to attend the Lancer Bridge Program to work on study skills, academic preparedness, and learn more about navigating and thriving in high school. The programming is part academic, part executive skills, and part social-emotional learning. After the August programming, there are quarterly check-ins for those students to reconnect and see how the year is progressing. There is a small additional cost for this program, but those who request financial assistance can receive support or waived fees.

Student Support Team:

AVID, St. Teresa, Counselors, and Vice Principals meet to evaluate student data (attendance, grades, progress, mental health, other issues, etc.) and identify interventions to
