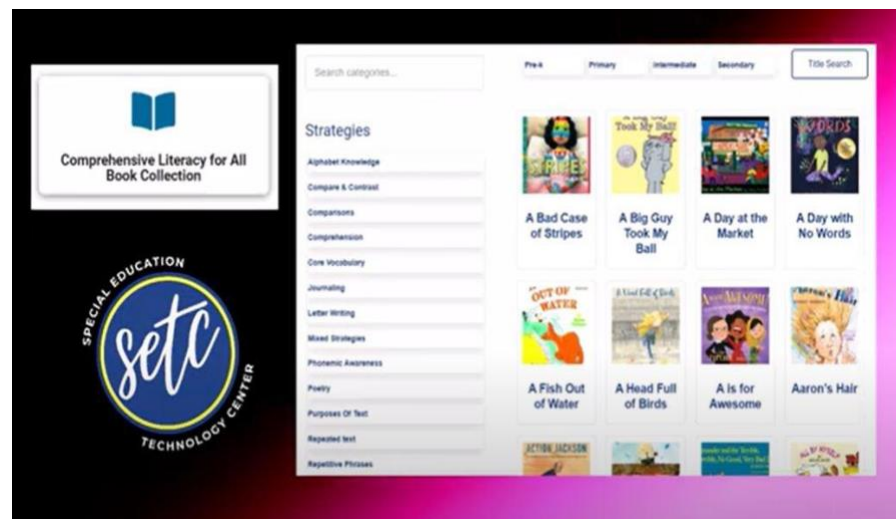

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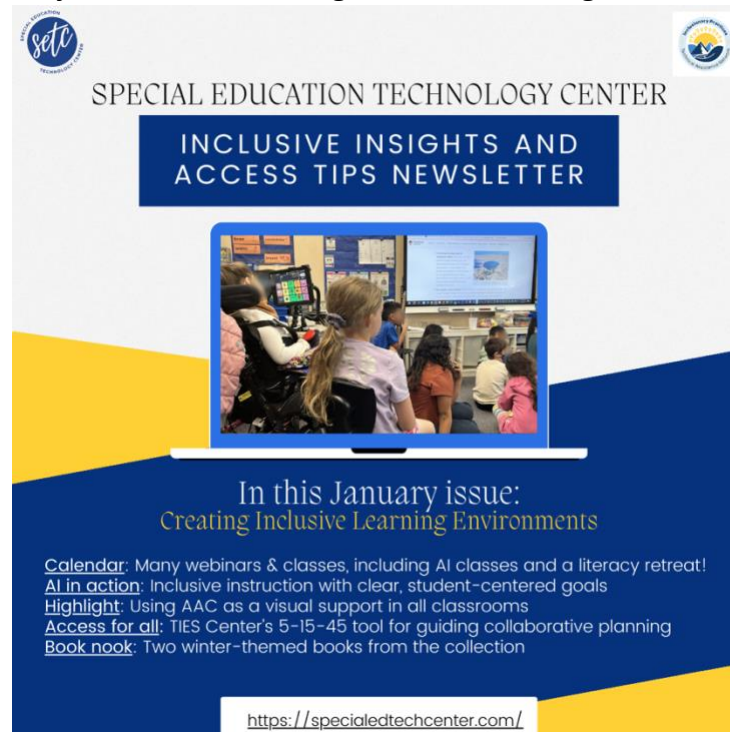

The schedule may be altered, and substitutions may be made as needed. We will email participants of any scheduling changes.

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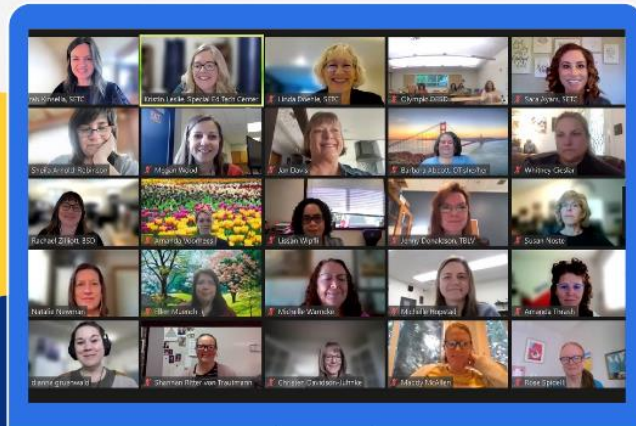

"In April 2024, the United States Department of Justice (DOJ) issued a final rule with website and mobile app accessibility requirements under Title II of the ADA. The Title II regulation applies to state and local governmental entities, which include SEAs and LEAs. Examples of web content under the revised regulation include, but are not limited to, images, text, and multimedia. A mobile app is software downloaded on phones, tablets, or other mobile devices. Conventional electronic documents are also covered. These include documents published in PDF, Microsoft Word, PowerPoint, Excel, and similar formats like Google Suite documents. As an SEA or LEA, your agency has two or three years from the publication of the regulation to meet the requirements. If your agency serves a population over 50,000, the deadline is April 24, 2026. Agencies serving a population under 50,000 and special district governments have until April 26, 2027."
